

EXHIBIT 12 PET OWNERSHIP POLICY

(Latest revision: 5/2016)

A. EXEMPTIONS

These rules do not apply to assistance animals needed by a person with a documented disability who has a disability-related reason for needing an animal. For these individuals, the Housing Authority may require documentation from a qualified medical practitioner with respect to:

1. Verification that the person making the request is a person with a disability.
2. Verification that the animal is needed by a person with a disability because of the person's disability.
3. Verification that the animal owned by the individual with a disability will meet the need identified.
4. Verification that someone in the household is able to care for the animal or that alternative arrangements that will not impair the animal's health or safety have been made.
5. Verification that the animal is currently on any required inoculations and that the animal, if a cat or dog, has been neutered or spayed.

B. PET RESTRICTIONS

The following animals are **not** permitted on the property under BHA's Pet Policy:

1. *Pets that are not considered common household pets, include but are not limited to:*
 - a. *Arachnids or insects*
 - b. *Pot-bellied pigs*
 - c. *Reptiles, including but not limited to snakes or lizards*
 - d. *Wild or feral animals, including but not limited to chickens and rabbits*
 - e. *Ferrets or other animals whose natural protective mechanisms pose a risk of serious bites or lacerations to small children*
 - f. *Any animal used for commercial breeding*
 - g. *Any animal not permitted under state or local law or code*
2. *Any animal which BHA reasonably determines is dangerous, viscous and/or intimidating.*
3. Visiting guests with pets (other than assistance animals to assist visitors with disabilities) will not be allowed without prior written approval of management.
4. *Any pet that has not been inoculated or spayed/neutered in accordance with BHA's Pet Policy.*
5. *Any pet whose **adult** weight is expected to exceed 30 pounds*

C. PET RULES

The following rules shall apply for the keeping of pets by Residents living in the units operated by the Housing Authority.

1. "Common household pets" as authorized by this policy means domesticated animals, such as cats, dogs, fish, birds, gerbils, hamsters or guinea pigs that are traditionally kept in the home for pleasure rather than for commercial purposes.
2. At any one time, each resident family will be allowed to house a maximum of two pets. (One 20 gallon fish tank or one bird cage with up to 4 birds shall be considered as one (1) pet).
3. Pets shall be limited to small breeds where total weight shall not exceed thirty (30) pounds at **maturity**. The size limit does not apply to assistance animals.
4. *Pet owner must provide verification that cat or dog is current on any required inoculations at the time of registration and annually at re-examination of income.*
5. *Pet owner must provide verification that cat or dog has been neutered or spayed at the time of registration or, in the case of underage animals, within (30) days of the pet reaching 3 months of age. Exceptions may be made upon veterinary certification that subjecting this particular pet to the procedure would be temporarily or medically unsafe or unnecessary.*
6. *Pet owner agrees that pet shall be quartered in the tenant's unit and shall be appropriately and effectively restrained (on a leash, harness or in resident's arms) whenever outside for play or exercise. Pets shall never be allowed to roam and must be under the control of a responsible individual at all times. Pets are not permitted in the yards of other residents or on specified common areas (under clotheslines, playgrounds, community rooms, office space, maintenance space, etc.).*
7. *Pet owner agrees that dishes or containers of food and water will be located inside the pet owner's dwelling unit and maintained in order to prevent roach infestation. Water, food and/or table scraps shall not be deposited on the pet owner's porches, in yards or other common areas.*
8. *No dog houses will be allowed on the premises and pets shall never be chained or tethered outside.*
9. *Dogs must be housebroken and cats must be trained to use a litter box. Pet owner is responsible for immediate cleanup of all pet waste inside and outside the dwelling unit. Pet waste is to bagged and securely tied and deposited in the trash receptacle outside the dwelling unit. **Pet waste must not be flushed down the toilet.** Pet owner agrees not to walk their pet in the yards of other residents or in specified common areas (under clotheslines, playgrounds, community rooms, office space, maintenance space, etc.).*
10. *Pet owner shall be responsible for any odor caused by their pet. Obnoxious odors can cause health problems and will be considered a serious violation of the Pet Policy.*
11. *Pet owner shall be responsible for noise caused by their pet. Noise (including loud or continuous barking) that threatens the right to peaceful enjoyment of other residents will not be tolerated and will be considered a violation of the Pet Policy.*
12. *Pet Owner shall responsible for providing an adequate flea control program for a fur bearing pet. Management may examine the pet for injuries or the apartment for parasites*

including fleas. If there are injuries, pet owner agrees to have the pet taken care of in a proper manner. If there are parasites, pet owner must rid the animal and dwelling unit of such, or management may initiate action to have the pet removed from the premises.

13. Residents are prohibited from feeding or watering stray animals.

14. Pet owner agrees to comply with any applicable City Ordinances concerning pets.

15. *Pet owner shall be responsible and liable for any and all bodily harm or destruction of property caused by pet. Any such injury or damage shall be the moral and financial obligation of the pet owner.*

16. Pet owner agrees the pet shall be removed from the premises when their conduct or condition is duly determined to constitute a nuisance or a threat to the health and safety of the pet owner and other occupants of the Housing Authority in accordance with paragraph E3 below.

17. **Pet Owner agrees that** landlord may after reasonable notice to the tenant and during reasonable hours, enter and inspect the premises. Entry and inspection is permitted only if the landlord has received a signed, written complaint alleging (or the landlord has reasonable grounds to believe) that the conduct or condition of a pet in the dwelling unit constitutes, under applicable State or local law, a nuisance or a threat to the health or safety of the occupants of the project or other persons in the community where the project is located. Please refer to your HUD Model Lease REV-1 for additional information regarding pets.

D. PET REGISTRATION

Each resident family will register their pets with the Housing Authority **BEFORE** they are brought onto the Housing Authority premises, and will update the registration annually at the re-examination of family income. The registration will include the Pet Policy, Pet Registration Form (Appendix 1) and for each pet registered:

1. A refundable pet deposit shall be made to the Housing Authority for cats, dogs, large birds or fish aquariums larger than (20) gallons, as follows:

Pet Deposit for pets registered on or before July 14, 2016 is \$100 per pet

Pet Deposit for pets registered on or after July 15, 2016 is \$150 per pet

(Such deposit will be a one-time deposit per pet and shall be used to cover cost of damages to the unit caused by the pet. **The pet owner will be financially responsible for costs resulting from damages caused by the pet that exceed the Pet Deposit.**

Small birds, gerbils, hamsters or guinea pigs that are confined to a cage and not allowed to roam about the unit and fish aquariums that are (20) gallons or less do not require a pet deposit. One fish tank or up to 4 birds will be considered as one pet. Note: Pet Deposit is required for large birds such as parrots or other large birds often let out of cages or for fish aquariums larger than (20) gallons).

2. A photo of the pet and information sufficient to identify the pet and to demonstrate that it is a common household pet;

3. The name, address, and telephone number of one or more responsible parties who will care for the pet if the pet owner dies, is incapacitated, or is otherwise unable to care for the pet.
4. A statement indicating that the pet owner has read the pet rules and agrees to comply with them; (*Appendix 2*)
5. ***Additional registration requirements for dogs or cats:***
 - a. A certificate signed by a licensed veterinarian or a State or Local Authority empowered to inoculate animals, stating that the pet has received all vaccinations/inoculations required by applicable State and Local Law.(Dogs and Cats)
 - b. A certificate signed by a licensed veterinarian or a State or Local Authority empowered to spay or neuter animals, stating that the pet has been spayed or neutered. (Dogs and Cats)
 - c. A copy of the Animal License issued by the City of Bastrop (Dogs)
6. The Housing Authority may refuse to register a pet if:
 - a. The pet is not a common household pet;
 - b. The keeping of the pet would violate any applicable house pet rule;
 - c. The pet owner fails to provide complete pet registration information;
 - d. The pet owner fails annually to update the pet registration;
 - e. The Housing Authority reasonably determines, based on the pet owner's habits and practices and/or the pet's temperament, that the pet owner will be unable to keep the pet in compliance with the pet rules and other legal obligations;
 - f. Financial ability to care for the pet will not be a reason for the Housing Authority to refuse to register a pet.
7. The Housing Authority will notify the pet owner if the Housing Authority refuses to register a pet. The notice will:
 - a. State the reasons for refusing to register the pet;
 - b. Be served on the pet owner in accordance with procedure outlined in paragraph E1 of this policy; and
 - c. Be combined with a notice of a pet rule violation if appropriate.

E. PET VIOLATION PROCEDURE

1. **NOTICE OF PET RULE VIOLATION (Appendix 3):** When the Housing Authority determines on the basis of objective facts supported by written statements, that a pet owner has violated one or more of these rules governing the owning or keeping of pets, the Housing Authority will serve notice.

- a. The notice will be
 - 1) by letter by first class mail, properly stamped and addressed to the Resident at the leased dwelling unit, with a proper return address
 - 2) in person to any adult answering the door at the Resident's leased dwelling unit, or
 - 3) if no adult responds, by placing the notice under or through the door, if possible, or else by attaching the notice to the door;
 - b. The notice must contain
 - 1) a brief statement of the factual basis for the determination and the pet rule or rules alleged to be violated.
 - 2) a statement that the pet owner has ten (10) days from the effective date of service of notice to correct the violation (including, in appropriate circumstances, removal of the pet) or to make a written request for a meeting to discuss the violation,
 - 3) a statement that the pet owner is entitled to be accompanied by another person of his or her choice at the meeting;
 - 3) a statement that the pet owner's failure to correct the violation, to request a meeting, or to appear at a requested meeting may result in initiation of procedures to terminate the pet owner's lease.
 - c. The effective date of service is the day that the notice is delivered or mailed, or in the case of service by posting on the door, the day the notice is posted.
2. **PET RULE VIOLATION MEETING:** If the pet owner makes a timely request for a meeting to discuss an alleged pet rule violation, the Housing Authority shall establish a mutually agreeable time and place for the meeting to be held within fifteen (15) days from the effective date of service of the notice of pet rule violation (unless the Housing Authority agrees to a later date).
- a. The Housing Authority and the pet owner shall discuss any alleged pet rule violation and attempt to correct it and reach an agreeable understanding.
 - b. The Housing Authority may, as a result of the meeting, give the pet owner additional time to correct the violation.
 - c. Whatever decision or agreements, if any, are made will be reduced to writing, signed by both parties, with one copy for the pet owner and one copy placed in the Housing Authority's Resident file.
3. **NOTICE OF PET REMOVAL:** If the pet owner and the Housing Authority are unable to resolve the pet rule violation at the pet rule violation meeting, or if the Housing Authority determines that the pet owner has failed to correct the pet rule violation within any additional time provided for this purpose under paragraph E1 above, the Housing Authority will serve the owner with a notice requiring the pet owner to remove the pet. This notice must:

- a. Contain a brief statement of the factual basis for the determination and the pet rule or rules that have been violated;
 - b. State that the pet owner must remove the pet within ten (10) days of the effective date of service of notice of pet removal (or ten days after the meeting if the notice is served at the meeting);
 - c. State that the failure to remove the pet may result in initiation of procedures to terminate the pet owner's residency.
4. **INITIATION OF PROCEDURE TO TERMINATE PET OWNER'S RESIDENCY:** The Housing Authority will not initiate procedure to terminate a pet owner's residency based on a pet rule violation unless:
- a. The pet owner has failed to remove the pet or correct the pet rule violation within the applicable time period specified in paragraph 3b above;
 - b. The pet rule violation is sufficient to begin procedures to terminate the pet owner's residency under the terms of the lease and application regulations;
 - c. Provisions of Resident's Lease, "Termination of Lease" will apply in all cases.

F. PROTECTION OF THE PET

If the health or safety of a pet is threatened by the death or incapacity of the pet owner, or by other factors that render the pet owner unable to care for the pet, the Housing Authority may do one of the following:

- 1. Contact the responsible party or parties listed on the registration form and ask that they assume responsibility for the pet
- 2. If the responsible party or parties are unwilling or unable to care for the pet or cannot be reached despite reasonable efforts, BHA will contact the appropriate State or Local Animal Control Authority, Humane Society or designated agent of such Authority and request removal of the pet.
- 3. If there is no State or local authority (or designated agent of such an authority) authorized to remove a pet under these circumstances, enter the pet owner's unit, remove the pet, and place the pet in a facility that will provide care and shelter until the pet owner or a representative of the pet owner is able to assume responsibility for the pet, but not longer than 30 days. The cost of the animal care facility provided under this section shall be borne by the pet owner. If the pet owner (or the pet owner's estate) is unable or unwilling to pay, the cost of the animal care facility may be paid from the pet deposit.

G. NUISANCE OR THREAT TO HEALTH OR SAFETY

Nothing in this policy prohibits the Housing Authority or the Appropriate City Authority from requiring the removal of any pet from the Housing Authority property if the pet's conduct or condition is duly determined to constitute, under the provisions of State or Local Law, a nuisance or a threat to the health or safety of other occupants of the Housing Authority property or of other persons in the community where the project is located.

H. PET AGREEMENT

1. Management considers the keeping of pets a serious responsibility and a risk to each resident in the apartment. If you do not properly control and care for a pet, you will be held liable if it causes any damages or disturbs other residents.
2. **Conditional Authorization for Pet.** You may keep the pet that is described in Pet Registration Form until the Dwelling Lease is terminated. Management may terminate this authorization sooner if your right to occupancy is lawfully terminated or if you or your pet, your guests or any other member of your household violates any of the rules contained in the Housing Authority's Pet Policy and Agreement.
3. The Pet Deposit will be \$ 150.00 for pets registered on or after July 15, 2016. (Pets registered on or before July 14, 2016, pet deposit will remain \$100.00) The Pet Deposit is a refundable deposit that will be used to pay reasonable expenses directly attributable to the presence of the pet in the complex, including but not limited to, the cost of repairs to and fumigation of the apartment.
4. The Pet Owner must provide a written notice to Management in the event the pet has been removed from the premises. Upon receipt of written notice, Management will inspect the unit to determine whether repairs or fumigation is required. The Pet Deposit will be used to cover these costs, if any, and any remaining balance will be refunded to the pet owner.
5. **Liability Not Limited.** The deposit under this Pet Agreement does not limit resident's liability for property damages, cleaning, deoderization, de-fleaing, replacements, or personal injuries.
6. **Description of Pet.** *A Pet Registration Form (Attachment 1) and a photo of the pet* must be attached for each pet registered. Pets may not exceed thirty (30) pounds at **maturity**. If at any time in the future, the pet is replaced by another animal, another Pet Registration Form must be completed.
7. Documentation evidencing that the pet (dogs or cats) has been spayed or neutered must be attached to the Pet Registration or, in the case of underage animals, within 30 days of the pet reaching 3 months of age. Exceptions may be made upon veterinary certification that subjecting this particular pet to the procedure would be temporarily or permanently medically unsafe or unnecessary.
8. Documentation evidencing that the pet (dogs or cats) are current on inoculations must be attached to the Pet Registration annually.
9. A copy of the City of Bastrop Animal License (dogs) must be attached to the Pet Registration annually.
10. I have read, fully understand and will abide by the rules and regulations contained in the Housing Authority Pet Policy and in this Pet Agreement.
